OVERVIEW

This sermon addresses the challenges facing the modern church, emphasizing the importance of deep, committed Christian community in a hyper-individualistic society. The pastor explores how genuine spiritual growth occurs within the context of long-term relationships, even through conflicts and difficulties. He contrasts the world's self-centered approach with Jesus' call for unity and love among believers, urging the congregation to resist the temptation to abandon community when things get tough.
